

A SCHOOL FOR CARILLONNEURS

The first school of "campanology" in America, to teach the art of bell-playing, will be inaugurated next season by the Curtis Institute of Music, it is announced by Josef Hofmann, director. There are only two other schools of this art in the world, one at Malines, Belgium, and the other at Oxford University. Students of the Curtis Institute will be sent to Mountain Lake, Fla., where Edward Bok has erected the famous Singing Tower. They will receive instruction under Anton Brees, carillonneur of the Bok Singing Tower. There are said to be thirty carillons in the United States, many of them silent because of the lack of qualified players.
