

# CARILLON AS MEMORIAL TO U. S. DEEDS IN WAR

While in the United States to arrange the details of the installation at Yale University of a set of bells, the largest to weigh 13,000 pounds, E. Denison Taylor, one of the most noted of the English bell founders, conferred in Washington with members of the Arts Club in reference to a national peace carillon to be erected in Washington as a memorial to commemorate the sacrifices of America in the World War.

The Taylor foundry recently has completed the carillon of forty-nine bells for the Town Hall of Rotterdam, now considered the finest carillon in Europe. The Washington carillon will duplicate these forty-nine bells and add five more at the lower end of the scale.

Owing to the recent studies and inventions bells are now tuned to an accuracy ununknown to the older bell-makers.
