Placing of a carillon in the tower of the Memorial municipal building in Norwood this month is a re-. minder that before long this progressive little town will provide the second opportunity available in Norfolk county for hearing beautiful music produced through the medium of great bells. Cohasset, at the seacoast edge of the county, has afforded pleasure and inspiration to thousands since the bells were installed there through the efforts of Mrs. Hugh Bancroft. That the installation has had an educative effect can hardly be questioned. Now Norwood is following suit, and doubtless the same good results will in time be realized, both with respect to increasing public knowledge and appreciation of this sort of music and also to making the name of Norwood widely known. Like Cohasset Norwood is on the line of a much-travelled auto route. So far as Quincy is concerned, the new bells will be virtually as easy to reach as those of Cohasset. Motoring music-lovers here may well congratulate themselves that these wonderful installations are both within the range of Norfolk county. Though carillons are being set up in many cities and towns of the United States since the war, not many counties so far include two sets.
