

## DR. ALBERT PITTIS.

Physician of Plainfield, N. J., Dies  
of Pneumonia at 54.

PLAINFIELD, N. J., Feb. 2. — Dr. Albert Pittis, 54 years old, for many years a practicing physician here, died last night at his home, 178 East Front Street, of pneumonia.

He was a graduate of the Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons. Although he never denied or affirmed the report, he is understood to have been the donor of the carillon chimes to Grace Episcopal Church of this city. He was a member of the Plainfield and the Union County Medical societies, served on the medical staff at Muhlenberg Hospital and was also a member of the Masonic Lodge, Chapter and Knights Templar, Commandery, this city.

A notable achievement in his professional career was the saving of the life, after many operations, of Wilson Frederick, now postmaster of Dunellen, when he was burned in a wreck on the New Jersey Central in 1902.

Surviving him are a sister, Mrs. T. J. Davis of Brooklyn and seven brothers, Thomas, Gregory, Bertram, Harold, William, Frederick and Cecil Pittis. Funeral services will be held at Grace Church on Saturday afternoon, with burial in Greenwood Cemetery.
