

SAVIOUR CHURCH HAILS CARILLON

Thousands in Heights Hear Dedicatory Recital

Thousands of residents of Cleveland Heights heard the dedicatory recital of the new 47-Bell Arter Memorial carillon of the Church of the Saviour yesterday afternoon.

Featured performer was 67-year-old Ferdinand Timmermans, who is the official city carillonneur of Rotterdam, Holland.

In a brief service on the church lawn Dr. Howard J. Brown, pastor of the church, led a litany of dedication following an anthem by the church choir.

Hundreds of persons stood in the bright sunshine to hear the bell recital, while many sat in automobiles parked for blocks in the vicinity of the church.

The carillon, the largest in Ohio and said to be one of the 10 largest in the Western Hemisphere, is the gift of Charles A. Arter in memory of his late wife and daughter.

World-Known Authority

The polished bronze bells, made by the Petit & Fritzen Co. in Holland, may be seen hanging in the large tower from the street and may be heard from some distance, depending on weather conditions.

Timmermans, world known as a carillonneur and authority on bells, played hymns, two marches by Bach, Handel's "March from St. Cecilia's Ode," "Mendelssohn's "Spring Song" and an original Sonate for Carillon. He presented a second program last night.

This is his first visit to the United States. He arrived here about 10 days ago.

Timmermans will play some 20 recitals on the leading carillons of this country and Canada, including the dedicatory recital for the new Dutch National Carillon in Washington, a gift from the people of Holland to the United States.

1,200 See Pageant

A colorful pageant depicting the need for clergymen, doctors, teachers, nurses and scientists in foreign mission fields highlighted the annual Children's Lenten offering presentation service at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral yesterday afternoon.

A crowd of 1,200, of whom 900 were children, filled the cathedral to overflowing. A child representing each of 28 Episcopal parishes and missions here brought forward a check for funds saved by youngsters in a Lenten "mite box" project. The funds are to be distributed among the mission fields of the Episcopal Church.

The procession included choirs of 20 church, each in a different colored vestment, some 75 crucifer and flag bearers and 25 clergymen.

Narrator was Canon Laurence H. Hall of the cathedral staff. Also participating were Dean Percy F. Rex, Rev. Stuart G. Cole of the Church of the Ascension, Lakewood, and Rev. Robert C. Dean of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Lyndhurst. St. Alban's Church, Cleveland Heights, was general chairman.

WINS JET STUDY AWARD

Former Clevelander Picked for Guggenheim Fellowship

Jack L. Kerrebrock, 26, of Pasadena, Cal., a former Clevelander, has been awarded a Guggenheim jet propulsion fellowship at California Institute of Technology, it was announced yesterday.

Kerrebrock, like other winners of this particular award, will do basic research in jet and rocket propulsion. The fellowships carry a stipend ranging from \$1,000 to

\$2,000 annually, plus tuition.

A 1950 graduate of Oregon State College, Kerrebrock spent two years here as an aeronautical research scientist at the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory. His wife is the former Miss Bernice M. Veverka of Cleveland.
