



ST. PAUL'S TO RING 23-BELL CARILLON

Michigan Professor to Play Easter Hymns

In what is hailed as the first carillon recital in Greater Cleveland, the new 23-bell set in the tower of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Cleveland Heights, will be played tomorrow by Percival Price, renowned carrillonneur of the University of Michigan.

He will play Easter hymns and other Easter music for a half hour beginning at 10:30, preceding the morning service, for a half hour after the service, and later at 3:30 in the afternoon.

Price is a graduate of the Mechelen School for Carolenneurs in Belgium and is a professor in the music department of the U. of M.

Fifteen bells cast in Holland were recently installed and added to the original set of eight bells in the church tower, making it the first complete 23-bell carillon in the city.

Guy Gray, who has played the St. Paul bells since 1935, is studying to master the enlarged "keyboard." The bells are played by large wooden levers, some of which are equipped with foot levers to permit the playing of three-note chords.

Plans are being made for a gala dedicatory recital later in the spring.
