Mr Westcott is carillonneur and professor of piano at Michi-

and professor of piano at Michigan State College and is recognized as one of the outstanding carillon artists in the United States.

HE IS ALSO an organist of note and a piano recitalist. Mr Westcott has recently completed what is considered an authoritative hook on the art of carillon playing.

For his recital he has chosen a group of selections from the works of Van Hoof, Handel, Bach, Schubert, Price, Brahms, Kreisler, Puccipi: Barnaby and

Kreisler, Puccini; Barnaby and G. Alex Kevan of Houston. The carillon at Saint John the Divine Church consists of 35

Divine Church consists of 35 bells. The largest weighs approximately 900 pounds, the smallest 25 pounds. The bells were cast in Holland at the Petit & Fritsen foundry, one of the oldest bell foundries in the

world.
THE REGULAR carillonneur for the church is it organist and choir master, Mr Kevan, who studied with Mr Westcott. One of Mr Kevan's compositions, "Gigue," will be featured on the program.
