Academy, School-House and Factory Bells.

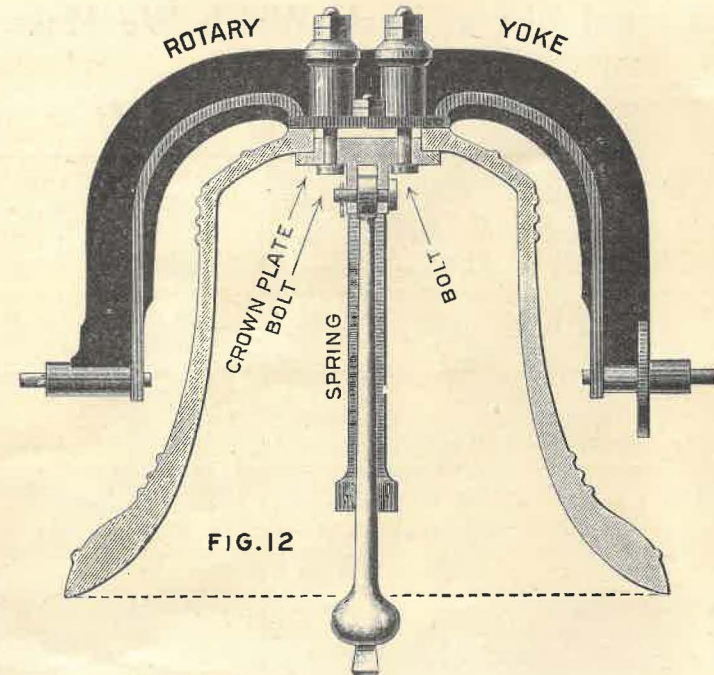

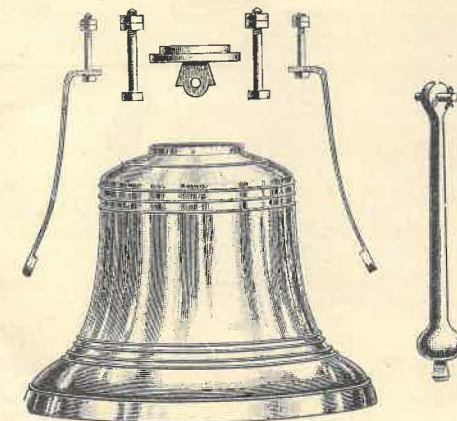

Illustrating Bell and Parts as Weighed.

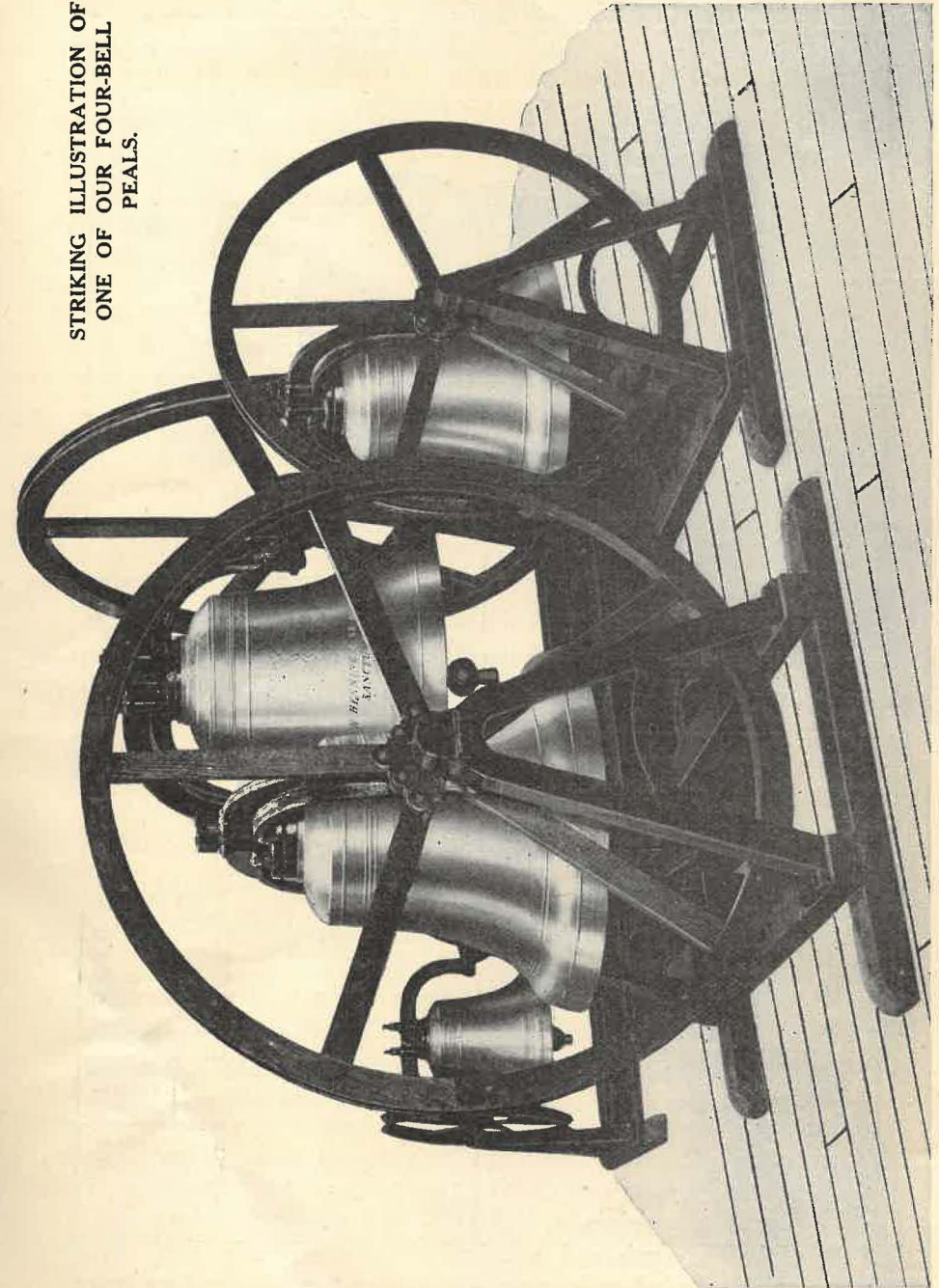

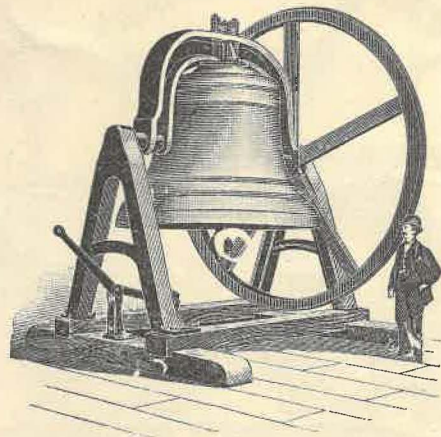

PATENT ROTARY YOKE,

by which the bell may readily be turned when desired (without un-hanging it), thus presenting a new point of impact for the clapper, thereby prolonging the durability of the bell.

By loosening the nuts of the bolts on top of the yoke, the bell can easily be turned circumferentially, thus presenting a new surface for the wear of the clapper, without disturbing the clapper or springs inside the bell, which will retain their proper position at right angles with the axis of yoke. The yoke for each size of bell is properly adjusted, so as to be rung easily, and yet give the proper force to the stroke of the clapper; and the axles, or journals, of the yoke being turned, and their bearings in the stands lined with anti-friction metal (bells of 1,200 pounds and over have friction rollers in hard brass boxes) allows the bell to be rung with comparative ease, and but little strain on the tower.

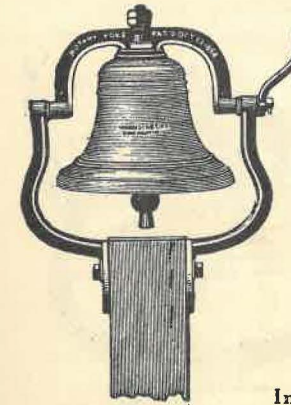

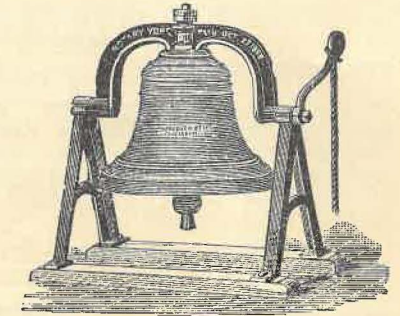

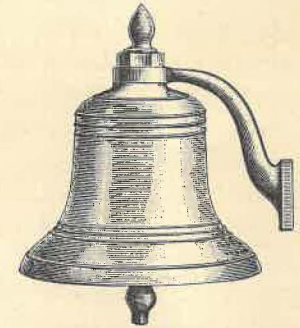

This is a favorite way of hanging fire bells for cities and towns where electric alarm system is likely to be put in place. The bell is thus properly hung for that purpose, and has a hand-power striking arrangement included, which can be used until electric system is adopted, and can (and should) be retained permanently, to use if the electric system should happen to be out of order or injured in some manner.

The striking may be done by rope attached to clapper and run over a pulley at side of tower, then straight down to person ringing alarm. Clapper is always adjusted before shipment to strike correctly. Electric alarm hammers strike on outside.

Some cities of 20,000 to 40,000 population, densely built, use one large bell of 2,500 to 4,000 pounds, centrally located in a well-arranged tower. Others of equal population, but greater area, use from three to six bells, ranging from 600 to 1,000 pounds each, and locate the towers to secure most effective results.

No fire alarm bell, however small the village or town, should be less than 300 pounds weight, and villages of 500 to 15,000 population should use one or more bells, as necessity demands, ranging from 500 to 1,000 pounds. The cost of the bells is saved five times over in each year to the town by the protection they effect in fire-fighting, by reason of their timely alarm.

Bells hung thus need no extra hangings, as the clapper and suspending bolts always go with the bell, but the ropes and pulleys form a separate charge, as following PRICE LIST, namely: two lengths of rope, two iron pulleys and iron plate for under side of beam.

Electric strikers must be so placed that the hammer will strike on same line of circumference of bell as clapper strikes, which is just a little ABOVE the head, near lower edge of bell. Electric alarm hammers strike on outside, and never interfere with the bell clapper.

OUR SHIPPING FACILITIES

Cincinnati is a great railroad center, there being railroad facilities for shipping quickly to all points of the compass; besides the river facilities eastward to Pennsylvania and westward to the Mississippi and down to the Gulf of Mexico. We can secure through freight rates to any port in the world, and to any railroad station in the United States and Canada, and we send out bills of lading for all shipments of over 100 pounds, with through freight rate thereon, which protects purchaser against exorbitant local rates.

INSCRIPTIONS

A suitably worded inscription put upon bells without charge. Copy should be sent with order, and should not be too large, as it then would mar the appearance of the bell.

OUR SUPERIOR ANTI-FRICTION ROLLERS

We put STEEL ROLLERS around the journals of our yokes of all bells of 1,200 pounds and heavier. Rollers are in hard brass boxes, and fit neat and close around journal so as to maintain equal pressure. By this arrangement and the superior poise of our bells in the yoke one man can ring any of our bells up to 5,000 pounds.

JUST A LITTLE BELL HISTORY

THERE is some contention among historians as to just when bells were first made. Authentic history tells us, however, that bells were used not later than the second century. At that time they had no resemblance to the present shape of bells, being merely flat metallic disks, a number of which were suspended by means of cords attached to them and to the robes of the high priests. When walking, these disks or bells would strike against each other, causing the sonorous vibration, which was to notify those within hearing of the approach of that high official. It is supposed that bells were first used as an alarm, which was to signify the approach of an eminent personage, or were sounded at the approach of an enemy. It is said the Greek warriors had small bells concealed within their shields, which they were required to ring at certain intervals while on guard. There was

at one time quite an amount of superstition connected with bells, the ringing of which was supposed to cause the driving away of evil spirits, great storms, lightning, etc.

Perhaps the first church bell was used in the year A. D. 400, at Champania, by St. Paulinus, Bishop of Nola. They were first introduced into England in the seventh century. Quite a number of immensely large bells have been found, the largest of which is at Moscow, cast in 1733. Its weight is about 440,000 pounds. Cost of the material in this bell is about \$300,000, which, it is said, is a rather insignificant sum compared with the value of the gold and silver plate and precious jewels, which were thrown into the furnace by the noblemen at the time of casting.

In regard to size, China ranks next to those of Russia, quite a number of which weigh from 40,000 to 150,000 pounds. But they are of much inferior quality to those of Europe. England has a number of large bells, the largest at Yorkminster, weighing 27,000 pounds. Long Tom at Oxford, 17,000; one each in London and Lincoln, weighing 12,000 pounds. Notre Dame Cathedral, Montreal, Canada, has a bell of about 29,000 pounds. The old mission churches of New Mexico, Southern California and Mexico have numerous bells which were cast in Spain in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. The Liberty Bell is probably the most historical of any in the United States. Its weight is about 1,500 pounds, and we are all quite familiar with the history.

It is said by some that the old bell in New York City Hall, weight 21,000 pounds, is the largest ever cast in America. This we must deny. In October 30, 1895, we founded the largest bell ever cast in America. The exact weight of bell only is 27,390 pounds; with mountings about 35,000 pounds. This bell hangs in the tower of St. Francis de Sales (R. C.) Church, in Cincinnati, O., and is the largest bell mounted in regular swinging church-bell hangings in the world.

Some changes have been made since, such as enlarging the clapper slot so that a great amount of metal surrounds the clapper pin,

and the strengthening of the yoke at the proper place to insure the greatest strength and durability. But a short time ago some of our competitors were telling their prospective customers not to buy a bell with a hole in it, but buy a whole bell." By this they referred to the hole in the top of our bell in which the crown is inserted and the bolts pass, making it the most simple and convenient manner in which to rotate the bell. The sentence, "buy a whole bell," referred to their own style with a big heavy lug on top, for which their customers had to pay bell-metal prices and received not a particle of benefit. Some are now copying our style. We can only say *beware* of those who copy and take upon themselves that which belongs to another.

In the manufacture of our bells we use the old German sweep or pattern, which enables us to furnish a bell of a certain tone at from fifty to two hundred pounds less weight than any of our competitors, and at the same time have the same full tone and carrying power. This we guarantee. We have furnished over 60,000 bells used in churches, schools and public buildings. We have bells in some of the most remote corners of the world, in Europe, Asia, Australia, South America, Mexico, and a great number in Canada, and in nearly every city, town and hamlet in the United States. We make a specialty of furnishing peals or combination bells in any required tones, guaranteeing perfect harmony. Look through the partial list of bells furnished; perhaps there is one in your own town or nearby. We refer you to this bell. Or, write the pastor, no doubt he will be glad to state his opinion. Every bell is guaranteed to meet with your entire satisfaction. It is a mistake to think our bells too high-price. They are the cheapest when tone, material durability and workmanship are considered. The life of one of our bells, if properly taken care of (cannot be estimated. A peal of four bells, weighing approximately 7,500 pounds, was cast by us for the St. Philomena Church in this city in 1846. These bells have been in daily use ever since, and are the sweetest toned bells in the city, although cast more than sixty years ago.
